LOCAL LAW NO. ____ FOR THE YEAR 2024

A LOCAL LAW RENAMING GANNETT DRIVE TO UNIVERSITY BOULEVARD

Be it enacted by the Village Board of the Village of Johnson City as follows:

Section 1. Gannett Drive, a street within the Village of Johnson City, shall hereby be renamed as “University Boulevard” and the Village map shall be amended accordingly.

Section 2. Remainder

Except as hereinabove amended, the remainder of the Code of the Village of Johnson City shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. Separability

The provisions of this Local Law are separable and if any provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part thereof is held illegal, invalid, unconstitutional, or inapplicable to any person or circumstance, such illegality, invalidity or unconstitutionality, or inapplicability shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, clauses, sentences, subsections, words, or parts of this local law or their application to other persons or circumstances. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this local law would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part had not been included therein, and as if such person or circumstance, to which the local law or part thereof is held inapplicable, had been specifically exempt therefrom.

Section 4. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.

VILLAGE OF JOHNSON CITY
LOCAL LAW NO. ____ FOR THE YEAR 2024

A LOCAL LAW NAMING THE HARRY L. DRIVE BRIDGE ENTRANCE TO WEGMANS

Be it enacted by the Village Board of the Village of Johnson City as follows:

Section 1. The unnamed public road which runs approximately 110 feet from Harry L Drive to the entrance of 650 Harry L Drive property line shall be named “Wegmans Drive” and the Village map shall be amended accordingly.

Section 2. Remainder

Except as hereinabove amended, the remainder of the Code of the Village of Johnson City shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. Separability

The provisions of this Local Law are separable and if any provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part thereof is held illegal, invalid, unconstitutional, or inapplicable to any person or circumstance, such illegality, invalidity or unconstitutionality, or inapplicability shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, clauses, sentences, subsections, words, or parts of this local law or their application to other persons or circumstances.
