Mayor Deemie asked to go into Executive Session with Chief Dodge.

EXECUTIVE SESSION #1

A motion to enter executive session at 5:00 pm for personnel in police department and legal advice was made by Trustee Reynolds and seconded by Trustee Giblin. The motion carried with all those present voting in the affirmative.

A motion to exit executive session at 5:24 pm was made by Trustee Giblin and seconded by Trustee Meaney. The motion carried with all those present voting in the affirmative.

EXECUTIVE SESSION #3

A motion to enter executive session at 6:19 pm for personnel, legal, budget and Ban and contract agreement made by Trustee Meaney and seconded by Trustee Reynolds. The motion carried with all those present voting in the affirmative.

A motion to exit executive session at 7:12 pm was made by Trustee Meaney and seconded by Trustee Reynolds. The motion carried with all those present voting in the affirmative.

Trustee Meaney questioned

- 14 Brady Street. He was contacted by the owner. She has reached out and no one got back with her. Can she have three sidewalk blocks taken out and grass put in?
 - Mayor Deemie responded he will have to check with Josh. There are certain regulations the Village must follow. There are also drainage issues over there. He will take a look at it.
- Mayor said he was going to open the parks and he thanks him for that and he was going to put hoops up in the parks at half court?
 - Mayor Deemie answered yes, on Memorial Day. We officially open the parks up on Memorial Day.
- 287 Grand Ave – He understands it is private property, but doesn't understand how we can allow that to go on? We should not allow that.
 - Mayor Deemie replied he drove by and he thinks it was painted over.

- 1) Was the generator for \$1019.00 in the sewer department budgeted for? **Yes, the generator budgeted for in the 2020-2021 fiscal year, the purchase became necessary to replace the old non-working generator in order to run electric powered equipment required for certain system repairs.**
- 2) Was the jack hammer attachment for \$10,000.00 in the water department budgeted for? **Yes, the jack hammer was budgeted in the current 20/21 budget line item F8340.2.503**
- 3) Will UHS reimburse the village \$107.52 for the large meter parts? **The large meter parts were to replace stock items for large meters and are not specifically related to UHS**
- 4) What happened to the door panel in the parks department truck \$355.91? **The door panel had literally been packed using old gloves for the past year in order for the metal to not injure the DPW employees riding in the truck. It had become so worn that it was no longer repairable. This was the door panel of Truck #10 (the chipper truck). We are seeing more problems of this nature arise due to the age of our fleet.**
- 5) I believe that the tips on meals from the police department should be removed. I do not believe that the taxpayers should be responsible for this.
- 6) I respectfully request that the \$160.00 in dues to the Broome County Fire Chiefs and Firefighters associations removed from the abstract.
