WHEREAS, said public hearing was duly held on the 18th day of January, 2022 at 7:35 p.m. and all parties in attendance were permitted an opportunity to speak on behalf of or in opposition to said proposed Local Law, or any part thereof; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (“SEQRA”), it has been determined by the Village Board that adoption of the proposed Local Law constitutes a Type II Action as defined under 6 NYCRR 617.5 (22) and (33); and

WHEREAS, the Village Board, after due deliberation, finds it in the best interest of the Village to adopt said Local Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Village Board hereby adopts said Local Law as Local Law No. 1 of 2022 entitled “A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 264 OF THE VILLAGE CODE ENTITLED ‘VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC’”, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Village Clerk be and hereby is directed to enter said Local Law in the minutes of this meeting and to give due notice of the adoption of said Local Law to the Secretary of State; and

**VILLAGE OF JOHNSON CITY
LOCAL LAW NO. 1 FOR THE YEAR 2022**

**A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 264 OF THE VILLAGE CODE
ENTITLED “VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC”**

Be it enacted by the Village Board of the Village of Johnson City as follows:

Section 1. Add a new Section 264-28.2 as follows:

§ 264-28.2. Ambulance only parking

Only official Ambulance or EMS vehicles shall use the parking spaces described in §264-106, attached to and made a part of this chapter, which are hereby reserved for the use of Emergency Medical Service agencies on official business.

Section 2. Section 264-98 shall be amended as follows:

§ 264-98. Schedule XXIII: Handicapped Parking.

Delete:

Name of Street	Side	Location
Baldwin Street	West	Meter Nos. 04 and 05
Harrison Street	West	Meter Nos. 13 and 14

Replace with:

Name of Street	Side	Location
Baldwin Street	West	Meter Nos. BS6 and BS7
Harrison Street	West	Meter Nos. H7 and H8

Section 3. Add a new Section 264-106 as follows:

§264-106 Schedule XXXI: Ambulance Only Parking

In accordance with the provisions of §264-28.2, the following are established as ambulance only parking:

Name of Street	Location
Harrison Street	West side of roadway starting at NYSEG Pole #1620-7 to 121 feet north to the driveway of 46 Harrison Street

Section 4. Remainder

Except as hereinabove amended, the remainder of the Code of the Village of Johnson City shall remain in full force and effect.
