A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE ADOPTION OF LOCAL LAW NO. 4-2025

WHEREAS, notice was given that the Village Board scheduled a public hearing for March 18, 2025 at 7:30 p.m. for Local Law No. 4 of the year 2025 entitled “A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 264 OF THE VILLAGE CODE REGARDING PARKING ON DIMENT STREET”; and

WHEREAS, notice of said public hearing was duly advertised in the official newspaper of the Village and posted on the Village Clerk’s sign board; and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was duly held on the 18th day of March, 2025 at 7:30 p.m. and all parties in attendance were permitted an opportunity to speak on behalf of or in opposition to said proposed Local Law, or any part thereof; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (“SEQRA”), it has been determined by the Village Board that adoption of the proposed Local Law constitutes a Type II Action as defined under 6 NYCRR 617.5 (22) and (33); and

WHEREAS, the Village Board, after due deliberation, finds it in the best interest of the Village to adopt said Local Law.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Village Board hereby adopts said local law as Local Law No. 4 of 2025 entitled “A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 264 OF THE VILLAGE CODE REGARDING PARKING ON DIMENT STREET”, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Village Clerk be and hereby is directed to enter said Local Law in the minutes of this meeting and to give due notice of the adoption of said Local Law to the Secretary of State; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution will take effect immediately upon filing with the Department of State.

LOCAL LAW NO. 4 FOR THE YEAR 2025

**A LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 264 OF THE VILLAGE CODE
REGARDING PARKING ON DIMENT STREET**

Section 1. § 264-87A. “Schedule XII: Parking Prohibited at All Times” shall be amended as follows:

Add the following:

Name of Street	Side	Location
Diment Street	West	Between Lowell Avenue and Pratt Avenue

Section 2. **Remainder**

Except as hereinabove amended, the remainder of the Code of the Village of Johnson City shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. **Separability**

The provisions of this Local Law are separable and if any provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part thereof is held illegal, invalid, unconstitutional, or inapplicable to any person or circumstance, such illegality, invalidity or unconstitutionality, or inapplicability shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, clauses, sentences, subsections, words, or parts of this local law or their application to other persons or circumstances. It is hereby declared to be the legislative intent that this local law would have been adopted if such illegal, invalid, or unconstitutional provision, clause, sentence, subsection, word or part had not been included therein, and as if such person or circumstance, to which the local law or part thereof is held inapplicable, had been specifically exempt therefrom.

Section 4. **Effective Date**

This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State in accordance with Section 27 of the Municipal Home Rule Law.
