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### **JOHNSON CITY – HYDRANT FLUSHING**

The Village of Johnson City Water Department will be flushing hydrants on the following days between 10:00 PM and 6:30 AM

- Oct 17<sup>th</sup> Olive Street and Brown Street area. The area between Harry L Drive and Carlton Street and Harry L Drive and North Street from N. Hudson Street east to Spruce Street.
- Oct 18<sup>th</sup> North Broad Street to Lester Avenue, south of highway to Pratt Avenue, Rogers Street, CFJ Blvd, Lower Stella Ireland south of Republic Street, Republic Street and Leigh Street, Leigh Street and Spring Street, Republic Street and Ukrainian Hill Road, Spring Street and Ukrainian Hill Road
- Oct 19<sup>th</sup> Harry L Drive hydrants from Oakdale Road east to N. Baldwin Street, Richard Street east to N. Arch from Harry L Drive North to Fairview Street
- Oct 20<sup>th</sup> Academy Street to Virginia Avenue from Harry L Drive north to Wren Street and Fairview Street, Balch Street, Miriam Street, Nicholas Avenue, Mill Place, Hillside Avenue and St Johns Pkwy
- Oct 21<sup>st</sup> Streets north of Summit Ave from to Wren Street and Fairview Street between Academy Street to Albany Avenue, Leigh Street and Virginia Avenue, Leigh Street and Colville Avenue, north dead end of Colville, Republic Street and Leigh Street.

This process is necessary to ensure the proper operation of the hydrants and to flush the water system to remove any sediment that may be present within the water mains.

During the flushing operations you may experience fluctuations in pressure and/or discolored water. The condition is temporary and does not pose a health hazard. If you experience discolored water, run your **cold** water tap until it clears up. During periods of discoloration postpone washing clothes and limit your use of hot water until the cold water clears.
